EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Human Resource Development Network organized its Annual All Members Meeting on 3-4 September 4005 at Best Western Hotel, Islamabad. This year, the two-day event was significant in the sense that the Network elected its Board of Directors from among the general body for the next three years. Keeping in view the past practices, the Agenda for AMM was developed in consultation with HRDN Members.

In his welcome address, Mr. Roomi S. Hayat, Chairperson HRDN, presented an overview of the Network's performance during the last year and shared the future plans of HRD Network with the general body that contains a variety of initiatives aimed at furthering the capacity of HRDN Members and enhancing their management skills.

Mr. Javed Jabbar, chief guest, praised network's gender and regional balance and its democratic way of electing the board of directors. He said that the development process should be inclusive and expressed his apprehensions on the educational institutions developing two kinds of human resources. He paid rich tributes to Mehbubul Haq who in his opinion was the pioneer of the idea of Human Development and HDI.

Saad Gilani, Programme officer Research, reported HRDN's achievements since the last AMM and highlighted the major changes in governance and management systems. Members gave their candid and frank feedback. The General Body formally approved the financial statements, presented by Adnan Sheikh, Programme officer Finance, by show of hands. The General Body also amended the clause 20 of the HRDN constitution. HRDN Board Election 2005 was held at Best Western Hotel Islamabad under the supervision of Miss Maneezeh, Chief Election Commissioner and election officer Mr. Adnan Sheikh. The newly elected Board members are Mr. Roomi S. Hayyat, Chairperson HRDN, Ms. Robeela Bangash, Ms. Aqeela Tahir, Programme Manager HR, Plan Pakistan, Mr. Haque Nawaz Khan Director General, Agriculture Deptt(founder members), Mr. Waqar Haider Awan, Programme Officer, NRSP-IRM, Mr. Mubashar Nabi, Management Executive, Save the Children UK, Mr.M. Sheeraz Aslam, Chairman, The Aims, Ch. Israr Ul Haq, NCRD(professional members), Miss Farhat Imran(general member) and Taraqee Foundation, ActionAid Pakistan and Awaz-CDS (organizational members). Roomi S.Hayat was again elected as Chairperson HRDN for next three years. The newly elected Board took oath of their responsibilities under the supervision of Ms Maneezeh Bano, Chief Election Commissioner.

Human Resource Development Network

INTRODUCTION:

Human Resource Development Network organized one of its regular events i.e Annual All Members Meeting on 3-4 September 4005 at Best Western Hotel, Islamabad. Sixth annual All Members Meeting (AMM) provided a unique opportunity to all the members of HRDN to share, learn, develop linkages with other members and give their inputs for further enhancing the effectiveness and relevance of HRDN's services. This year, the two-day event was significant in the sense that the Network elected its Board of Directors from among the general body for the next three years 2005-2008. The General Body of Human Resource Development Network meets once a year to review the Network's progress towards its stipulated objectives, take important long term and short term decisions, monitor progress and map out future course of action. Keeping in view the past practices, the Agenda for AMM was developed in consultation with HRDN Members. Invitation letters were sent to Members one month in advance and they were requested to convey any important agenda item to the Network Secretariat along with a brief write-up for its inclusion at appropriate place in the Programme.

Objectives

Major objectives of AMM - 2004 were to:

- Elect its Board of Directors from the general body for the next three years;
- Make Amendments in the constitution;
- Update HRDN members on the new developments in HRDN during the year;
- Share programmatic and financial progress of the Network;
- Provide an opportunity to members to interact with other members and develop linkages;
- Get Members' input on a range of programmatic and management issues of HRDN;
- Contribute towards professional development of members.



INAUGURAL SESSION

Inaugural session set the tone of the Annual All Member meeting. Key features of the session were the welcome address by Mr. Roomi S. Hayat, Chairperson HRDN and the address by the Chief Guest, Mr. Javed Jabbar. Mr. Roomi S. Hayat welcomed all members to the 6th general body meeting and presented an overview of the Network's performance during the last year. He mentioned that in a short span of 6 years, the Network has grown from a single room organization into an institution with strong roots in the development sector. He also shared the future plans of HRD Network with the general body that contains a variety of initiatives aimed at furthering the capacity of HRDN Members and enhancing their management skills.

Mr. Javed Jabbar was the chief guest of the event's first session. He praised the network's gender and regional balance in membership fold. He admired HRDN's democratic way of electing the board of directors and hoped that these are fair election with an independent Chief Election Commissioner unlike local bodies elections held in Pakistan recently. He said in his speech that development should be inclusive and the fruits of development should be for all not for only a few. This is the biggest challenge faced by the societies today. He expressed that Human development had been a focus of the nations since long but to him Dr. Mehbubul Haq, a great visionary from Pakistan, could rightly be called the pioneer of the idea of Human Development and HDI. In his view, Dr. Mehbubul Haq deserved to at least have shared the Nobel Prize for economics with Amartya Sen if not a sole winner Nobel Prize for economics. He expressed his apprehensions on the educational institutions developing two kinds of human resources. He said that it is very disturbing to see robots coming out of the prestigious private institutions that well fit the big corporations who know every trick of profiteering. On the other hand, public educational institutions produce human resources that find it almost impossible to find any gainful employment. Such situation would lead to further deepening the divide between the haves and have-nots and would put the country at a risk of large scale social disorder. At the conclusion of the inaugural session, Mr. Roomi Hayyat, Chairperson HRDN, presented a souvenir to the Chief Guest.







PROCEEDINGS OF DAY TWO:

Progress update of HRDN:

Mr. Saad Gilani, Programme officer Research, reported HRDN's achievements since the last AMM and highlighted the major changes in governance and management systems. The presentation also depicted the progress on major recommendations made by members during the 5th AMM. He also apprised the audience of the major financial transactions that took place during the last year. By and large, participants showed satisfaction over the progress.

Members Feedback:

Following is the gist of the discussion wherein the participants openly commented on the subject:

- Mr. Ghayas recommended that detailed reports should be shared with all the members so they could provide positive feedback.
- Miss humaira recommended that the word "delinquent" should be replaced with any other word like inactive etc.
- Miss Shaista asked about the programs of feedback of organizations as she had suggested it on the last AMM.
- Mr. Farooque pointed out that HRDN has not done anything for organizations. He further explained that the member organizations are looking for facilitation.
- In response Mr. Ghayas recommended that organizations are looking for HR systems not for training.
- Mr. Anis asked that has HRDN itself thought to include organizations and fully represent them or organizations themselves have to approach.







- Mr. Bakht Karam enquired if there were any special concessions are given to members coming from far flung and less developed areas. And he suggested giving them travel allowance and accommodations.
- Mr. Anis Danish asked whether HRDN was a donor organization.
- Mr. Farooque clarified that poverty alleviation can be one agenda but its not in the mandate.

Mr. Abid Rizvi shared that existing board didn't participate in the discussion forum held on web, in spite that a lot of people requested them to bring out their point of view.

Financial Report:

HRDN believes in transparency in all its financial transaction. The General Body also serves as budgetary watchdog of the organization. Mr. Adnan Sheikh, Programme officer Finance, presented the detailed report of the Network and explained all the budget heads of income and expenses. The General Body formally approved the financial statements by show of hands.

Constitutional Amendment:

There was just one constitutional amendment in clause - 20. The modified clause is

"The Constitution of the Society may be amended by a special resolution in a Board of Directors (BoD) meeting by not less than three fourth majority of the total members of the BoD."
